Our exciting Volunteer Peer Worker Project aims to offer individuals in recovery and family members the opportunity to develop new skills, take part in volunteer work-based placements and work towards accredited qualifications. Participants are a valuable part of local services and use their experiences to support others on their recovery journey.



Phase 1:

- Steps to Excellence® and self-management training
- 20 weeks at Ayrshire College, Ayr (2 days a week)
- A focus on health and social care related activities

Phase 2:

- 2 days a week work-based placement as a Volunteer.
- Peer Worker in a South Ayrshire service or community project supporting individuals or families affected by alcohol or drug use
- Opportunity to complete a health and social care related SVQ qualification at a Level 2 or 3.
- Participants are a valuable part of local services and use their experiences to support others on their recovery journey.

Throughout the project you will have:

- · Access to other relevant training
- Ongoing Peer Support
- Opportunity to attend recovery focused events and activities
- Public transport expenses during college and placement

What do I need to be considered for the project?

- Be a resident of South Ayrshire*.
- Aged 16 vrs.+
- Have been affected by your own substance use <u>or</u> have been affected by family members substance use.
- Be free from illicit drug use and problematic alcohol use.
- Have previous experience of volunteering (not essential)
- Be motivated and committed to attending and completing the project

*Applications from residents of East Ayrshire or North Ayrshire may be considered if places allow. Placements must be undertaken in a South Ayrshire service.
